


Ephesians 2:19 ff


Welcome one another – as Christ Welcomed you

Holy Kiss

The **holy kiss** is an ancient traditional <u>Christian</u> greeting, also called the kiss of peace or kiss of charity, and sometimes the "brother kiss" (among men), or the "sister kiss" (among women). Such greetings signify a wish and blessing that peace be with the recipient, and besides their spontaneous uses they have certain ritualized or formalized uses long established in Christian liturgy.
