The Power of the Cross – Divine Exchange

John 1:29 The next day he (John the Baptist) saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, **who takes away the sin of the world!**

Ex 12 – It is the **LORD'S Passover**. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And **when I see the blood, I will pass over you**, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

Hebrews 9:11 ff...But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and more perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation) he entered once for all into the holy places, not by means of the blood of goats and calves but by means of his own blood, thus securing an **eternal redemption**. For if the blood of goats and bulls, and the sprinkling of defiled persons with the ashes of a heifer, sanctify for the purification of the flesh, **how much more will the blood of Christ**, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, **purify our conscience** from dead works to serve the living God.....

(v26...). But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

The Process- Becoming Like Jesus

Hebrews 10:11ff. And every priest stands daily at his service, offering *repeatedly* the same sacrifices, which can **never** take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a **single** sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified.-

- Jesus was punished, that we might be forgiven.¹
- Jesus was wounded, that we might be healed.¹
- Jesus was made sin with our sinfulness, that we might be made righteous with His righteousness.^{2,3.}
- Jesus died our death, that we might receive His life.⁴
- Jesus was made a curse, that we might enter into the blessing.⁵
- Jesus endured our poverty, that we might share His abundance.^{6,7.}
- Jesus bore our shame, that we might share His glory.^{8,9,10.}
- Jesus endured rejection, that we might have His acceptance with the Father.^{11,12.}
- Jesus was cut off by death that we might be joined to God eternally.^{13,14.}
- Our old man was put to death in Him that the new man might come to life in us.^{15,16.}
